Very Worried Somewhat Worried





Trend: Iraq and Health Care Top the Interest List, with the Economy Rising


Thinking about the campaign for the presidential election in 2008, what two issues would you most like to hear the presidential candidates talk about? (open-ended, top 4 responses shown)






New Hampshire Exit Poll January 8, 2008

Which of these is the single most important economic issue facing you and your family?


