


Overview of the Medicare Program

The Medicare program was signed into law in 1965 to provide health coverage and increase financial security for older Americans. Today, the program has achieved near universal enrollment of the over 65 population, with beneficiaries having relatively comprehensive coverage and access to care.

Current Beneficiaries

In 2018, 60 million individuals were enrolled in Medicare, 51.2 million ages 65 and older, and 8.8 million persons with disabilities.

The Medicare Program Today



Part A: Hospital Insurance: inpatient hospital stays, skilled nursing facility care, hospice health care, and home health care



Part C: Medicare Advantage: combines Part A and Part B coverage

In 2018, 21.3 million (35.6%) of Medicare beneficiaries were enrolled in MA plans.



Part B: Supplemental Medical Insurance: physician care, outpatient medical services, preventative care, and durable medical equipment



Part D: Prescription drug coverage

In 2018, **45.8 million** beneficiaries were enrolled in prescription drug coverage (PDP) plans.
