THE 2025 AWARDEES





Michael J. Astrue served as the 15th
Commissioner of the Social Security
Administration from 2007 to 2013. Earlier in his
career, he held multiple senior federal positions,
including Associate Counsel to Presidents
Reagan and Bush, Counselor to the
Commissioner of Social Security, Acting Deputy
Assistant Secretary for Human Services
Legislation at the U.S. Department of Health and
Human Services, and General Counsel of HHS. In
these roles, he successfully litigated landmark
federal enforcement cases on HIV discrimination
and patient dumping and helped implement
early regulations under the Americans with
Disabilities Act.

As Commissioner, he prioritized reducing the disability backlog and enhancing public service, with a strong emphasis on expanding electronic services. He led the development of innovative systems to fast-track disability claims, established National Hearing Centers that use video hearings to ease local caseloads, and modernized the agency's electronic services, making them faster, simpler, and more user-friendly.

Martin O'Malley served as the 17th
Commissioner of the Social Security
Administration from 2023 to 2024.
Previously, he served two terms as Governor of Maryland (2007–2015) and as Mayor of Baltimore (1999–2007). Recognized nationally for pioneering the use of datadriven governance, O'Malley introduced CitiStat in Baltimore, a performance-measurement system that became a model for accountability and transparency in public administration.

At SSA, he prioritized improving customer service, simplifying processes, and advancing the agency's digital-first transformation. Under his leadership, SSA streamlined forms, expanded document upload and e-signature options, and modernized case-sharing across state agencies to reduce disability backlogs. His reforms earned bipartisan praise for restoring fairness and efficiency, including new policies that prevented the full garnishment of overpaid beneficiaries' monthly checks.
